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WELCOME NOTE

Primary spinal tumors are inherently rare entities presenting with a wide range of biological pathways in tumor genesis. Despite to their complexity in diagnosis, grading and resulting therapy, clinical studies and scientific investigations of spinal oncology have long time lagged behind similar work on oncosurgical studies of the extremities. However, several publications lately presented multicentre-based data giving closer insight and better understanding to the pathophysiological behavior. Notably, among the partly unknown prognostic variables decisively influencing course and outcome of spinal malignancies, the underlying tumor biology has been turned out to be the most important factor. Thus, the spine tumor community must provide answers to the questions, how these heterogeneous tumor activity guide treatment and – whenever possible – surgical and oncological concepts must be tailored to the individual constellation.

We anticipate that specific recommendations for future research and treatment of spinal resection and reconstruction techniques will evolve from the comprehensive collection of topics, which in turn subsequently promote intense exchange of experiences in usually very creative and entertaining discussions.

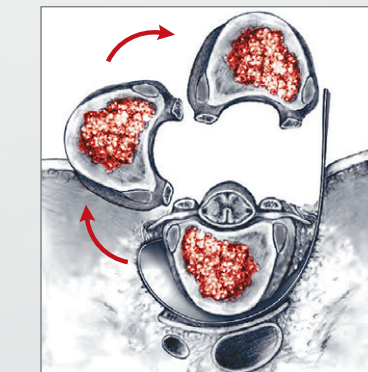
